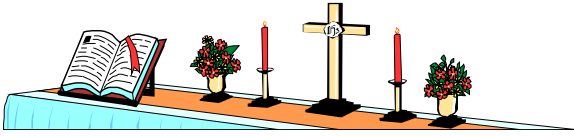
Wonder and Awe

4. Are there times when you wished your faith was stronger?
5. What did Jesus do when he was challenged and needed to have his faith strengthened?

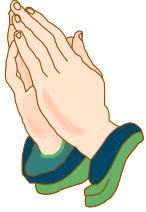
Summary

4. When do you like to pray? Or, how can you work at making prayer more consistent in your life?
5. Does prayer always use words? Can our actions or our service to others be a way of prayer? Discuss.

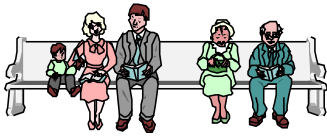
Summary

CHURCH

1. Name some service organizations in our community or our country that help make our world a better place? What do they do?
2. Name two to three service organizations within our parish of St. Michael that minister to our parishioners? What do they do? (Hint: Look in our church bulletin or the Parish Ministry Directory at <http://www.stmichaelcommunity.org>.)
3. Just what does the term “church” mean? (Not the building!)
4. How important is faith and prayer to the church (not the building)? Share some examples.
5. What does it mean to be an ACTIVE member of the *church*? (the parish *church* and the *church* in the world)
6. Sponsors, share with your candidate your “apostolic” work. How does this service help to build the Body of Christ and the Church?

Summary

When you choose to be confirmed, you are promising to be an active member of the Church for the rest of your life. The Church is referred to as the “Bride of Christ” in Scripture. That is how much Jesus Christ loves His Church! Ask yourself how you are ready to commit to a covenant relationship as the bride of Christ.

RESPECT FOR LIFE

1. Newspapers and magazines are filled with stories of senseless killing. How do you think God feels when he sees his children acting like that?
2. Talk about ways we “kill” people other than physically.
3. In contrast, what effect does showing love and concern have on another person? Can you think of a time when your love or concern for someone else made a difference?
4. Talk about a story or stories in Scripture when Jesus sought out the lonely and unwanted and showed friendship to them.
5. Killing a person physically, emotionally, and intellectually is wrong because it denies the act of creation we are all expected to participate in. God has bestowed life on each of us. He expects us to nurture that life and in that way to help Him in the creative process. Our call is to respect life and to treat life as sacred. In light of this, why do you think the Church tries to:
 - a. Offer women other choices besides abortion?
 - b. Support the care of the elderly and the infirmed until natural death?
 - c. Stop the death penalty?
 - d. Warn against the misuse of drugs and alcohol?

Summary

We, as Catholic Christians, believe that LIFE is the most precious gift we have been given. For this reason, we are entrusted by God to cherish that life in ourselves and in others. We are called to be “co-creators” in helping every person become the best they can be! At Confirmation, you are committing yourself to carry out the value of respecting life. Are you ready to accept this challenge?

5. In asking to receive the Sacrament of Confirmation, the final Sacrament of Initiation, you are asking to take on the commitment of being the Body of Christ for others. What goals can you set for yourself today to help you continue to serve the world as you grow and mature?

Confirmation is a life-long commitment to become like Jesus Christ. To be committed is to do a task when it is easy as well as when it is not so easy. Through Confirmation we commit to carry out the work Jesus left us when he commissioned the apostles to go out and to tell all the world of his Father's love!
