It is our sincere prayer that you take this opportunity to explore your faith and to become excited about being Catholic as we prepare together to celebrate your Confirmation in the spring of your eighth grade.

PARISH MASS SCHEDULE

Saturdays: 5:00 PM (fulfills Sunday obligation)
Sundays: 7:30 AM, 9:00 AM, 10:30 AM, Noon

As Catholics we are expected to attend Mass every Sunday. Religious Education classes do not take the place of the Sunday obligation. The classroom experience is enhanced when children attend Mass with their family and the Mass experience is enhanced by the classroom teaching.

THE JUNIOR HIGH RELIGIOUS ED CLASSES MEET ON WEDNESDAY NIGHTS

Our calendar offers 22 regular class meetings on Wednesday nights and numerous other opportunities to gather for special events. For the regular classes, students are placed in both a Block class which is taught by our Catechists and also a Shepherd group.

We ask our 7th grade students and a parent to attend one of the orientation meetings on either:

- **Sunday, September 12th at 3:00 PM in the Church**
OR
- **Sunday, September 19th at 3:00 PM in the Church**

Students will receive their class schedule and a folder of information at these meetings. Our curriculum and expectations both during class and outside of class will be explained at these meetings. Other useful information will also be given out, so we ask that you make every effort to attend.

We ask our 8th grade students to attend one of the Confirmation meetings with a parent. Sponsors are also encourage to attend if possible. These meetings will be on:

- **Sunday, September 12th at 4:30 PM in the Church**
OR
- **Sunday, September 19th at 4:30 PM in the Church**

Information regarding the preparations for Confirmation, the requirements, the dates, the role of the sponsor, etc. will be discussed at this meeting. **Because we will have a packet of information for the Confirmation Sponsors, it is extremely important for every 8th grade student to have chosen their sponsor before these meetings in September.** If anyone needs help in finding a Confirmation sponsor, please feel free to contact the Faith Formation Office - we are very happy to assist you.

WHAT TO EXPECT ON JUNIOR HIGH NIGHT

6:00 - 6:25 PM - *Come for SOM (Support Our Mission):* Students are invited to come to the Parish Center (aka the school's cafeteria) for dinner or what we call, *Come for SOM*, to meet with friends or just "hang out." This time is optional and students are free to arrive any time between 6:00 and 6:25. We sell pizza, snacks, desserts, and drinks until 6:20 PM for a nominal fee. The profits are used to fund scholarships for our week-long summer mission trip with Catholic HEART Workcamp. (And of course, all 7th and 8th graders are invited and encouraged to experience Catholic HEART Workcamp!)

6:30 - 7:25 PM - Block Classes and Catechists: Junior high classes are divided into four Blocks with each Block having five classes focusing on a common theme. Students will be given a new book at the beginning of each block. Students rotate at the beginning of every block to a different classroom, with a different catechist, and a new theme. This allows every student to experience four different catechists, four different themes, in four different classrooms by the end of the year. Students in the block classes are either all male or all female and students from the different middle schools are mixed to encourage new friendships, renew friendships from previous years, and widen the experience of knowing other Catholic junior high students. Because great care is taken in placing students, once classes begin in September, there will be **no switching of class assignments**. All placements are final.

As students arrive for class, we ask that they wait in the Faith Center lobby, School lobby, or cafeteria until 6:25 PM. At 6:25, the students will be asked to go to their assigned class. **All students are expected to be in their classroom, ready to begin at 6:30 PM.**

Parents, please offer your support in prayer and as a volunteer catechist for the coming year. (Tuition for Catechists' children is waived.) Ongoing training and support are offered throughout the year.

7:30 - 8:15 PM - Shepherd Groups: The junior high evening continues with the students going to a Shepherd group or small youth group. The "Shepherd" or mentor guides the students as they pray together, complete service projects together, and engage in a wide variety of discussions together. Shepherds are encouraged to make a two-year commitment so that the same adult Shepherd remains with the same group of students for all of seventh and eighth grade. Male and female students from the same middle school are placed together for the Shepherd group so that there is a strong chance for students to be with friends and familiar faces.

Parents, please offer your support in prayer and as a volunteer shepherd for the coming year. (Tuition for Shepherds' children is waived.) Ongoing training and support are offered throughout the year.

All students are dismissed at 8:15 PM. Students are required to attend classes each week from 6:30 - 8:15 PM. Because we have over 200 junior high students coming every Wednesday evening for classes, we use the classrooms in both the school and the Faith Center. Generally the 7th grade students are assigned classrooms in the school and the 8th grade students are assigned classrooms in the Faith Center. Students will find their schedule and classroom assignments for the year on the cover of their folder given to them at the Orientation meetings or Confirmation meetings in September.

CHRISTIAN SERVICE

Much more than just accumulating service hours, we strive to nurture an *attitude of service* as one of the cornerstones of our lives. We understand that Jesus cares much more about our *attitude and willingness to serve* than simply how many hours we serve because we are obligated to. Paul writes in his letter to the Philippians: "Each of you should look not only to your own interests, but also to the interests of others. Your *attitude* should be the same as that of Christ Jesus." One very good way to test our hearts for true love of God is to observe our attitude and willingness to serve others on a regular basis. Teens are asked to give of their time, talent, and energy all throughout the year. While many of the service efforts can be individual projects some may find ways to serve as a group.

PARENT PARTICIPATION

Because our Catholic faith is begun and nurtured at home and then is supplemented in a more formal way with Religious Education classes, it is important for parents and volunteers to support and encourage faith formation outside of the classroom setting. Some important ways to do this are:

- **Attend Mass with your child(ren) on Sundays and Holy Days** and receive the Sacraments of Eucharist and Reconciliation (Confession) frequently. Your example speaks volumes.
- Because we are called to be Christ's hands, feet, and voice for one another, encourage your child in participating in the service opportunities offered in the parish and in his/her Shepherd group.
- Show an interest each week in the activities happening in your child's class. Invest a few minutes each week to review the material your child covered while in class and to check for homework assignments that need to be completed and turned in on time.
- Make an effort to introduce yourself to your child's Catechist and Shepherd and stay in contact throughout the school year.
- Support our parish family with your prayers, the gift of your time, and financial support.

CONTACTING CATECHISTS OR SHEPHERDS

We ask parents desiring to contact a Catechist or Shepherd to please leave a message with Mrs. Cathy Swanson in the Faith Formation Office. Home phone numbers or e-mail addresses are not given out without permission from the Catechist or Shepherd first.

ATTENDANCE VOLUNTEERS

Two attendance volunteers are needed in the school building and two in the Faith Center during every class. They are responsible for picking up the attendance sheets at the beginning of the block classes and at the beginning of the shepherd groups. They also monitor access to the classrooms during class time.

SPECIAL NEEDS

We welcome all of our young people and try our best to accommodate children with special needs. We have a special needs assistant to help the coordinator and our catechists and shepherds with our junior high students who have special needs. Open communication is vital to our being able to tailor our program to a child's particular circumstances, so we ask that parents share any insights about their own child/ren that might be helpful for us to offer the best possible experience for all our young people.

MEDICATIONS

We cannot store or dispense medications to any child.

ABSENCES

We ask that you call the Faith Formation Office to report an absence (630-682-3650) before class begins. If no one is in the office when you call, please leave your name, your child's name and grade on the voice mail. (We appreciate it if you would speak clearly and spell any unusual last names.) If no call is received for a student who is absent for either the block class or the shepherd group, our Attendance Volunteers will call home so as to be in compliance with Diocesan policy.

It is the responsibility of the student to find out what was missed during an absence and to make arrangements with the Catechist to make up the work.

TARDINESS / EARLY DISMISSAL

Classes begin promptly at 6:30 PM. Students are expected to be on time. If a student arrives late for class they should first check in with the Attendance Volunteers otherwise parents may receive a phone call reporting the student absent. (This can cause confusion as to whether or not the child is in class or is missing.) A student can only be dismissed early if he or she has a written notice from a parent or guardian. The notice should be shown to the Attendance Volunteers and the classroom Catechist or Shepherd before leaving the building.

SAFETY ISSUES

Crossing between the school and Faith Center in the middle of the street is dangerous. In order to make this safer, cars may NOT park or stop in the area directly in front of the Faith Center on both sides of the street that are identified with the orange cones. Please cross at the corners. Drivers should use extreme caution when in the vicinity of our buildings especially before and after class and follow the flow of traffic. Please do not park in the fire lanes as cars may be ticketed or towed by the Wheaton Police Department.

Everyone must exit the building when the fire alarm sounds. Students should stay together with their class unless you are specifically instructed to do otherwise. If you are changing classes, go outside and find the Catechist that you just left and stay with them. In case of a severe weather alarm, everyone should go into the hallways outside your classroom and be seated along the walls. Remain there until instructed otherwise.

SECURITY ISSUES

Volunteers will be given a name badge to wear while in the buildings. **Students should carry their folders every week as their ID badge.** For the safety of all, visitors are asked to check in with the Attendance Volunteers at the entrances to the school and/or Faith Center before proceeding further.

INCLEMENT WEATHER / CLASS CANCELLATIONS

In case of hazardous winter road conditions or other emergencies, Religious Education classes may be canceled. The decision to cancel classes will be made by Mrs. Cathy Swanson, the Junior High Coordinator. We are now using the *SchoolReach* program to inform our families of closings and other important announcements. A recorded message from our office will be delivered to the home phone number for all students registered in our program. Please inform the office if your phone number changes.

STUDENT GUIDELINES

We strive to instill strong moral values and high standards of excellence in our students. We address these values and standards in a number of ways. We also strive to keep all students as safe as possible while attending classes or other events. To help with this we ask all our students to follow the following guidelines:

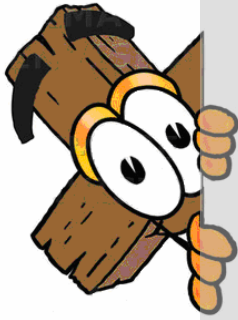
- Once parents drop off students, they should go directly into the building. Students should never leave the property until they are picked up again after dismissal at 8:15 PM.
- Pizza, pop, or other food must be eaten in the cafeteria and is not allowed to be taken to the classrooms. All trash must be placed in the trash cans before leaving the cafeteria for class.
- Any student arriving for class before 6:25 PM should gather in the lobby of the Faith Center, the school cafeteria or the school atrium, and are not to go into any of the hallways or classrooms until 6:25 PM. This allows the Catechists time to get to the classroom first and be prepared to meet their students as they arrive. At 6:25 PM all students should go directly to their classrooms.
- Student may enter a classroom only after the Catechist or Shepherd has arrived. If no Catechist or Shepherd is in the classroom, please wait quietly in the hallway outside that assigned classroom until an adult arrives.
- Anyone needing to use the bathroom or get a drink of water should do so only before class begins at 6:30, while changing classes from 7:25 - 7:30, or at the end of the evening after dismissal at 8:15. Only if it is an emergency, should you ask to be excused to use the bathroom during class time.
- Great care is taken in grouping students in their classes. Once classes begin in September, there will be no switching of class assignments. All placements are final.
- Please respect items, projects, books, posters, etc. and any other equipment or supplies that are either on display or left in the classrooms or in the hallways. They may be viewed, but not touched or disturbed. Students should sit only in the classroom chairs. Sitting on top of the desks, on tables, or on the arms of furniture may cause them to break.
- Please *walk* in the hallways and throughout the buildings. Quiet, "inside" voices are to be used.

- The elevators are to be used only by students in wheelchairs or with an injury that requires a cast or crutches.

DISCIPLINE ISSUES

1. Catechists and Shepherds will handle discipline in their rooms as much as possible. Our Catechists and Shepherds are volunteers and most are not professionally trained teachers. Because of the position they are in, they deserve our utmost respect! Coming to class is a privilege. Our goal is to form classes where students feel safe while exploring different aspects of our Catholic faith.
2. If, however, a student is so disruptive to the class that the Catechist or Shepherd is repeatedly forced to spend time handling the behavior, the student will be sent to Faith Formation Office on the 3rd floor of the Faith Center. Students will be given a *Discipline Slip* from the Catechist or Shepherd with the time they left the classroom on it and they must arrive at the office within 3 minutes. Mrs. Swanson will have a serious discussion with the student and assign written work that must be completed during the remaining time for that class and at home, if necessary. A parent must sign the assignment once completed and it must be returned to Mrs. Swanson before the student is admitted to class the next week. If the student arrives without the SIGNED assignment, they will be sent to the Faith Formation office and the parent will be called and asked to either come with the signed assignment or to pick up the student and take them home until it is completed.
3. If a student is sent to Mrs. Swanson's office a second time during the school year, we will have a serious discussion and then immediately call a parent. The student will not be allowed back in class until the written assignment is completed as before.
4. If a student is sent to Mrs. Swanson's office a third time during the school year, we will have a serious discussion, a parent will be called to set up an appointment with Mrs. Swanson. At that time a decision will be made regarding future classes or whether it would be better to continue Religious Education studies at home.

Attached is the Proposed 2010-2011 calendar for Junior High RE Classes as of March 2010. The final approved calendar will be in each student's folder given at the Orientation or Confirmation Meetings in September.

Every summer we offer two week-long mission trip experiences. We join Catholic HEART Workcamp and over 350 other teens from around the country to work (by helping low-income seniors fix up their homes or by helping in soup kitchens or day care centers), pray, have fun, sing, attend Mass and Confession, have more fun, perform skits, laugh a lot, and discover that serving God by being Christ for others is fun and very rewarding. In past years we have taken groups to Anderson, IN; St. Louis, MO; Nashville, TN; Greensboro, NC; Milwaukee, WI; Mishawaka, IN; Toledo, OH; Memphis, TN; Champaign, IL; and Dayton, OH. Next summer we will be offering two more trips. Students who have completed 7th grade through 12th grade are invited to come.
